An Amazing Story

If you ask most children, in fact many adults in this world, what Easter is all about, they'd probably say something about the Easter bunny or a break from school or work. It's a pervasive story out there in the world. Not very persuasive or compelling one, but nonetheless widespread. The story of the Easter bunny and spring break vacations threaten to displace a much more compelling story. A true story. A historical accurate story. An amazing story.

The amazing story concerns a man, a carpenter, who lived a little more than 2,000 years ago in a backwater Roman province in a town called Nazareth. At age 30, the Man hung up his leather carpenter's apron and began to speak up and down the countryside about his Father.

Religious leaders were ambivalent at best. Most felt deeply threatened, because this excarpenter taught in huge outdoor meetings with compelling authority -- and he even healed people. Not just colds and fevers, but crippled limbs and blind eyes. On a couple of occasions, he even brought people back from the dead.

The religious leaders saw their orderly world, their firm grip of control, spinning out of reach. And so they determined to eliminate the Man. And once in custody, they engineered a trial behind closed doors, and then put huge political pressure on the Roman governor to execute him immediately. Within 12 hours of his arrest, the Man hung on a cross. Six hours later he was dead -- seemingly a martyr to a glorious but hopeless cause. But there's more. The Man did not resist his arrest and crucifixion -- in fact, he had predicted it to his followers again and again. And he taught that his death would have incredible meaning -- that he would give his life as a ransom for many. That is, his death would pay the ransom price for a multitude of people who were enslaved by their own sins -- and set them free. That's what he said. And on that cross he prayed for his crucifiers -- certainly enslaved in their sins -- "Father, forgive them, for they don't know what they're doing." And he died. A Roman centurion who saw him die said, "Surely, this man was the Son of God."

He died on a Friday at just about three in the afternoon. By dusk he had been buried by a rich follower in a tomb hollowed out of solid rock, a tomb protected by a huge stone that rolled into place along a channel in the rock, then clunk! The tomb was secure by any standard.

But Sunday morning, the Sunday we call Easter, some women had come to complete the hasty burial and they found the stone rolled back and the tomb empty. An angel appeared to them saying, "He is not here, he has risen." This, too, the Man, Jesus, had foretold to his followers.

Over the next 40 days, he appeared to his disciples and others, to even 500 at one time. And then he left earth promising to return. His Spirit was poured out on his followers a few days later. Within a single generation his followers travelled with this amazing story to all of the known world. Our world has never been the same. History changed that resurrection day. Where people believe the story, they find forgiveness and freedom and meaning. They receive the Spirit of God themselves and they began to love.

Lent is the season, period of time, of 40 days which immediately precedes Easter. Lent begins on Ash Wednesday (February 14), and continues until the day before Easter (March 31), which is known as the Great Vigil of Easter.

Lent is typically recognized as a time of self-reflection and spiritual preparation before the eternal joy of the Lord's resurrection.

The events in the church have a particular importance, each in their own right, yet necessarily deeply connected as a powerful foundation of faith.

- 1. Ash Wednesday from the ancient practice of placing ashes on the foreheads of believers as a sign of humility before God, a sign of sorrow and death that our sin brings into the world.
- 2. 5 Sundays after Ash Wednesday typically a time to help the believer prepare their heart and mind before Easter comes. The Sundays serve as points of reflection on what needs to change in our lives to purify our relationship with Christ.
- 3. Palm Sunday celebrates Jesus' prophetic entry into Jerusalem as the promised Messiah.

 This grand entrance begins Jesus' final week on earth.
- 4. Maundy Thursday remembrance of the day the Christ celebrated the Passover with his disciples, know as The Last Supper.
- 5. Good Friday remembering the suffering of Jesus, his passion and pain, ultimately resulting in his crucifixion.

With the Resurrection of the Lord Sunday (Easter) we begin the season of Eastertide.



- 2. Ways to submit prayer requests:

 - C. Phone 724-872-7414 (church office) 606-261-0232 (Pastor John)
 - D. Text message 606-261-0232 (Pastor John)
 - E. Worship fill out the orange prayer request card in pews
- 3. Prayer requests will remain on the list for 30 days.
 - requests may be updated and remain on the list for an additional 30 days.
 - if no updates are made, the request will be removed after 30 days.
- 4. Since this is our church's prayer list, please submit requests for immediate family of members, regular visitors, church staff, Presbytery and/or PCUSA specific issues. (immediate family= spouse, children, grandchildren, mom, dad, brother and sister)
- 5. Specific items will remain on the list indefinitely such as: our church, Pastor and family, our country, our military, Session and community.
- 6. List will contain names of people only. There will be no specific information, medical diagnosis, procedures, etc.
- 7. List will be distributed weekly in the following ways:
 - email (must complete form to receive prayer list)
