"What If..."

What would you do if you weren't afraid? Have you ever thought of or pondered that question? Fear has a way of stopping us in our tracks. For some it can derail everything and be simply too much to handle. For most of us, it is more of a hurdle than it is a mountain before us. Fear has a way of keeping us in our boxes (comfort zone) because that unknown place outside of our comfort zones is just a little too wild, somewhat unpredictable, and scary.

One of the most frequent requests that God gives to us in Scripture is to "fear not." Fear is one of those things that gets in the way on our faith journeys, it is one of those things that keeps us from experiencing the fullness of who God is, how he is moving in the world, and who he is calling us to be individually and collectively as a church. When God called Moses out of his comfort zone at the burning bush (Exodus 3:1-17), Moses' first responses are fear: fear of failure, fear of not being enough, fear of how people will respond, fear of the unknown. Out of his fear, Moses begs with God to please just send someone else and let Moses keep living his comfortable and mostly predictable life. Well, as it turns out, God calls Moses beyond his fear, recognizing that these are indeed scary things but that he will be with Moses through it all.

When the Israelites heard from Moses what God was going to do, they too responded with fear. Because as much as they wanted freedom, the risk and uncertainty were frightening and so time and again they remain where they are. These are countless stories from Scripture of people experiencing fear and God calling them beyond that fear. Fear is a reality of life and something that we all have in common. We all meet and experience fear on a regular basis, whether we are aware of it or not. And that fear we meet impacts our decisions whether we realize it or not. Sometimes this is really helpful. A healthy fear of heights, for example, can keep us from an accident. But often our fears impact our actions and thoughts in less than constructive ways. Often our fears cause us to box ourselves in or to become stagnate, they cause us to respond in anxious ways with others rather than with the love we should.

Maybe in those hundreds of times God asks us to "fear not" in the Bible, he isn't asking us to do the impossible. Maybe God is asking us to decide what we will do with our fears, to decide if we will let them hold us back or if we will hear the call of God to follow Jesus into that unknown, wild place of God's love. So, what would you do if you weren't afraid? It's a question I have been talking about with some of you, with Session, with our youth, as we discern how God might be calling us to serve in our community. There will be, in the near future, several announcements made about new mission projects, new programs, new ways to experience God. We will outline a few ideas on making this already great church even greater!

Consider this: Maybe if we weren't afraid we would reach out to that person we haven't talked to in a while. Maybe if we weren't afraid we would tell someone we love them. Maybe if we weren't afraid we would talk about our faith more openly with those we encounter daily. Maybe if we weren't afraid we would try something new that we might fail at. Maybe if we weren't afraid we might use that failure to try again and succeed.

What would you do if you weren't afraid?

Hygiene Kit

- 1 hand towel (approximately 16" x 28", no fingertip, bath towels, dish towels or microfiber towels)
- 1 washcloth
- 1 wide-tooth comb (remove from package)
- 1 finger or toe nail clipper (no metal files or emery boards; remove from package)
- 1 bar of soap (bath size in wrapper)
- 1 toothbrush (in original packaging)
- 10 Band-Aids® or other adhesive bandage strips

Please do not add toothpaste to the Hygiene Kit. Toothpaste which has an extended expiration date will be added to international Hygiene Kit shipments just prior to shipment. Seal all items in a one-gallon plastic bag with a zipper closure.


Take Me Out to the Ballgame!



- Approved moving forward with initial application and process of developing a food pantry in conjunction with Westmoreland County Food Bank.








Mobility issues holding you back???
