Traditionally, Christians are called to deepen their spiritual lives, coming closer to God through "giving something up." The idea behind this is to strip away or "give up" something that is unnecessary and to be more mindful of God's presence and his working in our lives.

There is one significant issue in this day and age with this practice – no one likes to give up much of anything. For many, this is too great of a challenge and it results in little if any change in their life during Lent. This holy season, this time of preparation for Resurrection Day needs to be a part of our faith!

Therefore, to keep Lent as a season of preparation, I am offering an alternative to "giving up" by "adding to" the practice of our faith. The goal is the same – to be more mindful of God's presence and working in our lives. Additionally, it may help you develop a habit of working out your faith through acts of service. May this season of Lent deeply enrich your faith and "Happy adding to!"

- Pray for at least 5 people
- Make it a day of compliments for everyone you meet!
- Write a letter (or an e-mail) to one person who has touched your life through their time, talent, or treasure. Tell them how grateful you are.
- Give to someone in need. Meet a real need with your time, talent, or treasure.
- Get out in nature. Observe the beautiful world God has created. Thank him for his creation.
- Refrain from all gossip for one day. Speak nothing but the absolute truth.
- Read a whole chapter of any book in the Bible.

- Offer forgiveness to someone or ask forgiveness from someone.
- Take someone to lunch or for a cup of coffee and simply enjoy one another's presence.
- Set beside someone new during worship.
- Read a book about faith/God/spirituality.
- Volunteer at a local non-profit.
- Pray specifically for your church/Pastor/Session.
- Do something you have putting off doing.
- Clean out your closet and donate the clothes you no longer need/want.
- Call someone and tell them how glad you are to know them and that they are a part of your life.
- Donate blood.
- Study Jesus' Sermon on the Mount (Matthew & Luke's account)
- Do a random act of kindness (pay for person behind you when ordering food, for example)
- Slow down. Notice God and his working in people, places, and things.
- Donate food to a local food bank.
- Visit a nursing home and talk with the residents.
- Read a Lenten devotional every day.
- Reconnect with someone you haven't spoken to or seen for a long time.
- Get some exercise go for a walk!
- Read all four Gospels in the Bible (Matthew, Mark, Luke, John)
- Have a buy nothing day! (Focus on what you already have).
- Write a poem or story about your journey in faith.
- Take a day off reflect on God and all that he is to you.
- Laugh watch a funny movie or whatever. It's good medicine.
- Have a positive day everything positive in word and deed.
- Attend Bible Study (Wednesday evenings or Thursday mornings)
- Shop locally.
- Plant some seeds get ready for your garden.
- Send flowers to someone and thank them for "just being who they are."
- Forgive yourself. Nobody is perfect or needs to be.
- Go on a prayer walk. Walk around your neighborhood and pray for the things you see.
- Study a biblical character and determine how God used that person.
- Sponsor a child offer to pay the fee for a soccer, baseball, or softball league.
- Start a Charity Change Jar put in spare change each day and then keep doing so for a year.
 Donate to your favorite charity.



Future weeks to note on your calendar: Mar 6, Apr 24, June 5, July 24, Sept 11, Oct 30, and Dec 18



Coffee Fellowship Hour usually takes place following worship, on the second Sunday of every month, in our social room.





NEW WINDSOR-- MISSION WORK OPPORTUNITY



Redstone Presbytery PW is going to organize our annual work trip and invite you to participate. But **there will be changes to this trip** because there are changes happening at New Windsor. It will cost more but

it will depend on your choices. We will not be staying at the Hospitality Center on the campus. We will be staying at the Best Western Hotel near Baughers Restaurant in Westminster about 4 miles from New Windsor. Continental breakfast is included in the hotel cost. Lunch will be provided for all workers. Dinners will be on your own. I have reserved 20 slots so we hope you will return and we always welcome new volunteers. We will be traveling to New Windsor, MD on Sunday, September 24th; leaving about 2PM and returning on Tuesday evening, September 26th. We will work two days.

We could be working in the Materials Resource Warehouse where volunteers assist with processing and quality control of the hygiene kits, school kits and clean-up buckets. Some volunteers will be assigned to SERRV pricing and quality control. Volunteers package or price handcrafted articles from artisans in 150 cooperatives and nonprofit organizations in 35 developing countries and regions of the U.S. Most of the work is done while seated at tables.


The cost of lodging which includes breakfast at the hotel will be \$100. There will be additional costs for travel and dinners. We plan to carpool so the travel cost will be divided by the number of participants in each vehicle. You will also have an opportunity to shop in the SERRV outlet which is also located at the New Windsor site.






